Apart from acting jobs, the most interesting jobs I have had were writing an English language book in Taiwan, based on episodes of The Brady Bunch; working at a pre-release program at Green Haven Maximum Security Prison; and teaching

English as a second language in New York City.

Part of the beauty of this career is that you never know where it will take you. My goal for acting is to always pursue excellence. People who create their own work and their own characters, such as Louis C.K., Ricky Gervais, and Lena Dunham, inspire me. They write fabulously and create characters with loudly beating hearts. On Childhood

I was born in New York City, where I spent my first two years. From the ages two through five, I lived in Delhi. As a young girl coming back to the States from India, I remember being quite bewildered by many

things in the US: the food portions, the un-extended nuclear family, the rude way children talked to their parents, and the overt sexuality of Greenwich Village at the time, not to mention the new life I was expected to lead. I think I dealt with all of the change by hiding in characters I created to entertain my family. The characters were actually just different parts of myself that I wanted to explore. Then, through ballet, I was afforded the calm and assurance that came from the physical discipline and expertise in an art form I loved. Later, there were the crazier teen years that included sneaking into Studio 54 and dancing so much that I broke my leg! Even now, I don't think my parents need to hear about that.
